Place of Hope Luncheon Celebrates 3 years of serving local foster children

At the third annual Sea of Hope Luncheon, four local heroes were honored for their devotion to foster children.

On March 29 at Willoughby Golf Club, guests witnessed volunteer Jennifer Burrage receive Volunteer of the Year, while local foster family Richard and Ericah Brinson received Foster Family of the Year. Rep. MaryLynn Magar accepted a Legislator of the Year award, and Place of Hope's second annual Hero of Hope award was given to Rani Mathura.

"Place of Hope has done so much for our community and children. I'm blessed to be able to help foster families in our area because what they do truly matters," said Burrage. "They are impacting the future of these children by being the hands and feet of Jesus."

Co-chaired by Caye Johnson, Cristy Brown and Deana Peterson, this annual signature luncheon raised money to sustain and grow its programs, as well as the recruitment and licensing of more loving foster families.

More than three years ago, Place of Hope was invited to expand into the Treasure Coast to respond to the need for foster families. Since February 2015, Place of Hope has cared for more than 209 children, licensed 80 foster families and witnessed 21 adoptions.
